Children with Type 1 diabetes must rely on a daily controlled diet, frequent blood glucose monitoring and insulin injections just to stay alive. YDA provides care support and counselling service to children and adolescents with diabetes and their families. YDA also plans and organise various educational, community and fundraising activities to increase the public's awareness of the seriousness of diabetes for children with the condition and to increase the public's understanding of diabetes.
