About the Regional Knowledge Event and Policy Course

In addition to the Regional Knowledge Event, CHSPR and ANHSS will hold a three-day Policy Course on Health System Transformation: Private Sector Engagement for Primary Care Led Integrated Health Care from 5 to 7 December 2023. The course has attracted over 40 participants, including health policymakers, senior managers from public hospitals, practitioners working in the private health sector, researchers and post-graduate students in the Asia-Pacific region. The opening session of the Policy Course on the morning of 5 December 2023 will be open to the public. Keynote presentations will be delivered by **Dr Libby Lee**, Under Secretary for Health of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, **Dr Teodoro Herbosa**, Secretary of the Department of Health in the Philippines, and **Dr Maria Endang Sumiwi**, Director General of Public Health, Ministry of Health of Indonesia, who will provide insights into challenges of health system private sector engagement for primary care-led, integrated healthcare from their respective countries' and areas' perspectives. **Dr Tony Ko** and **Mr Henry Fan**, respectively Chief Executive and Chairman of the Hong Kong Hospital Authority, will also join the opening session.

The Regional Knowledge Event and Policy Course aims to foster in-depth discussions and knowledge exchange to strengthen health system and community resilience in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, and the transformation of health systems to primary care-led, integrated healthcare. By bringing together policymakers, healthcare professionals, researchers and experts from various countries and areas, the events provide a platform for sharing experiences, lessons learnt and innovative strategies. The insights gained from these events will contribute to enhanced health system preparedness for and response and resilience to future public health threats, as well as the engagement of private sector for primary care-led, integrated healthcare.
